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Preface

Health is crucial for sustainable development, both as an inalienable human right and an essential contributor to the economic growth of society. It contributes to national development through productive employment, reduced expenditure on illness care and greater social cohesion. The last few decades have seen notable gains in the health of citizens in India. However, the dual burden of infectious disease coupled with non-communicable disease presents unique challenge to the health system in resource constrain low and middle income countries like India. The Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of Gujarat has created a wide and robust network of health and medical care facilities across the state to provide best possible health care at the door step of every citizen of Gujarat.

The State Government is committed to provide equitable access of affordable accountable and quality of health care from primary to specialist services to all citizens. To achieve these, sufficient health care infrastructure, skilled health provider manpower, affordable medicines and diagnostics facilities are required, so that all citizens get equitable and quality health care. In spite of increase number of medical colleges and students in last few years, the doctor: population ratio is still less and many students go to other States and foreign countries for medical education. At present most of the specialist healthcare services including facilities of diagnosis and treatment are focused in urban and peri-urban areas, while more than half of population is leaving in difficult rural and tribal areas. So, there is gross disparity between urban and rural/tribal areas in terms of demand and supply of healthcare and also in terms of health indicators. Therefore, to increase supply of trained medical human resources and also to enhance healthcare facilities in difficult rural and tribal areas, the state government has set forth Health Policy 2016. This will help extend reach of health infrastructure besides providing to be a big attraction for health tourism creating tremendous employment opportunities in the state.

Scheme for Establishment of New Self-Financed (Green Field) Medical College.

Period of Scheme :

From 13-12-2016 to 31-03-2022.

Eligible Area :

Entire State of Gujarat.

Eligibility :

As per the Medical Council of India "Establishment of medical colleges regulations, 1999" as amended from time to time.

Assistance :

1. Assistance of Rs. 15 lakhs per seat per year in M.B.B.S. Course for a maximum period of five years. (Total Rs. 75 lakhs per seat)
2. Reimbursement of electricity duty in the electricity bill of medical college and attached hospital for five years.
3. Additional assistance applicable as per "Scheme for purchase of equipments to provide healthcare facilities by private and Non-Govt. organizations".
4. 50% discount on the prevailing market price of the land for trust within State except areas under the Municipal Corporation of the State as per resolution of Revenue Department.

Scheme for Establishment of New Self-Financed (Brown Field) Medical College at Govt. Hospitals.

Period of Scheme :

From 13-12-2016 to 31-03-2022.

Eligible Area :

Tapi, Banaskantha, Amreli, Bharuch, Dahod and Panchmahal District.

Eligibility :

As per the Medical Council of India "Establishment of medical colleges regulations, 1999" as amended from time to time.

Assistance :

1. Land: Available land of the Govt. hospital will be given on lease with existing building.
2. Building: To make available 300 beds for establishment of new medical college, Govt. will carry out the construction for deficient beds or assistance will be given for the construction.
3. Equipments :
 - (1) All the equipments (with CMC) in existing hospital to be given on lease.
 - (2) Eligible for additional assistance for purchase of high end medical equipments as per Govt. scheme for purchase of equipments to provide healthcare facilities by private and Non-Govt. organizations.
4. Assistance of Rs. 7.5 lakhs per seat per year in M.B.B.S. Course for a maximum period of five years. (Total Rs. 37.5 lakhs per seat)
5. Reimbursement of electricity duty in the electricity bill of medical college and attached hospital for five years.
6. Eligible to receive the annual grant from the government equal to hospital receiving presently.

Scrutiny Fees :

As decided by the Government.

Scheme for Starting New Super - Specialty Hospital in Private Sector.

Period of Scheme :

From 13-12-2016 to 31-03-2022.

Eligible Area :

Entire State of Gujarat.

Eligibility :

Medical graduate registered with the Gujarat Medical Council, registered partnership firm or institute registered under law.

Assistance :

1. Eligible to get 10% of capital subsidy of bank loan amount for purchase of medical equipments (Maximum up to Rs.10 crores).
2. Eligible to get up to 4% interest subversion for up to 7 years on authorized bank loan amount (limited to maximum Rs.40 crores).
3. Reimbursement of electricity duty in the electricity bill of hospital for five years.

Scrutiny Fees :

Demand draft of Nationalized bank of Rs. 20,000/- drawn in favour of government.

Scheme for Purchase of Equipments to Provide Healthcare Facilities by Private and Non-Govt. Organizations.

Period of Scheme :

From 13-12-2016 to 31-03-2022.

Eligible Area :

1. Diagnostic Services Centre: Entire State except area included in Ahmedabad, Vadodara, Surat and Rajkot Municipal Corporation. For Charitable Trust – Entire State of Gujarat.
2. Basic Specialty Hospital: Entire State except cities having more than 2 lakhs population.
3. Super Specialty Hospital: Entire State of Gujarat

Eligibility :

Medical graduate registered in Gujarat Medical Council, registered partnership firm or institute registered under law.

Eligible Equipments :

1. Diagnostic services centre : Radiology and Cardiology equipments.
2. Basic speciality hospital : Anesthesia, E.N.T., Gynecology, Ophthalmology, Orthopedics, Medicine and Critical care equipments.
3. Super speciality hospital : Cancer, Cardiology and Kidney equipments.

Assistance :

1. Only for purchase of new equipments.
2. 20% of the average purchase price of the equipments for entire State except backward Talukas of the state.
3. 30% of the average purchase price of the equipments for backward Talukas of the state.
4. No other assistance for operation, maintenance or land building.

Whom to Apply :

Concerned Chief District Medical Officer

Scrutiny Fees :

Demand draft of Nationalized bank of 1% of proposed equipments, minimum Rs. 5,000/- and maximum Rs. 20,000/- drawn in favour of Government.

Incentive Scheme for Establishment of New Self-Financed (Green Field) Medical Colleges with Hospitals Equipped with High-End Facilities in the State.

Proposal of the Commissioner (Health, Medical services and Medical education) vide its SFS Note dated 25/1/2016.

Preamble :

Medical education contributes significantly to make available services of M.B.B.S. doctors to demand of human resources in Government as well as private hospitals of the state. At present the number of registered medical graduates in the state is approximately one per 2000 population. The State Government intends to increase it and make available one doctor per 1000 population.

The State Government has significantly increased the number of medical graduates by establishing 11 medical colleges on self-finance basis since the year 2001. Still a large number of students seek admission in the institutions located in the other states and shortage of doctors is evident especially in remote and rural areas of the state. Moreover, the State Government has realized on the basis of experience of last 15 yearsthat it is necessary to attract and encourage self-financed medical colleges for development of medical education in the state.

Medical education is an emerging area in education. The State Government seeks to provide facility of medical education to youth of the state in their own state instead of their seeking it in other statesand to provide incentive to start medical colleges (Green Field) on self-finance basis with a view to overcome the shortage of the doctors in the state.

It was under active consideration of the Government to frame a new policy to provide incentives to private, semi-government or autonomous institutions established under law for establishment of new self-financed medical colleges (Green Field) with hospitals equipped with high-end facilities.

Resolution :

After careful consideration, it is resolved to provide incentives for establishment of new self- financed (Green Field) medical colleges with hospitals equipped with high-end facilities in the state subject to the following terms and conditions.

1.1 The Name of the Scheme : This scheme will be known as "Incentive Scheme for establishment of new self-financed (Green Field) medical colleges in the state".

1.2 Period of Scheme : This scheme will remain in force till 31/3/2022 from the date of issuance of this resolution. The assistance will be payable to new self-financed medical colleges which have started functioning before dated 31/3/2022 i.e. before the expiry of the time limit of this scheme. Medical college established before the commencement of this resolution will not be entitled to get any assistance under the scheme.

2. Definitions :

2.1 New self-financed (Green Field) medical college : A new self-financed (Green Field) medical college established in accordance with rules and regulations of the Medical Council of India will be known as New self-financed (Green Field) medical college.

3. Eligible Area : Whole of the state will be considered as the eligible area to get the assistance for new self-financed (Green Field) medical college.

4. Eligible Person : The institutions eligible to establish a medical college, as per "The Establishment of Medical College Regulation, 1999" of Medical Council of India and amendments to it from time to time, will be eligible person for the purpose of getting assistance under the scheme.

5. Amount of assistance :

5.1 This assistance is only for the purpose of establishment of new self-financed (Green Field) medical college for the course of M.B.B.S. as per rules and regulations of the Medical Council of India.

5.2 The assistance of Rs. 15 lakh per seat will be available after completion of admission process of the first year M.B.B.S. keeping in view the number of sanctioned seats to the eligible person who has got the letter of permission (LOP) to start new self-financed (Green Field) medical college from M.C.I./ Government of India. After receiving the renewal permission for next year from the M.C.I./ Government of India, the assistance of Rs. 15 lakh per sanctioned seat will be available for the respective year. This assistance will be available only for five years after the start of new self-financed (Green Field) medical college. No assistance of any kind will be available after five years under this scheme.

- 5.3 The electricity duty paid in the electricity bill of the medical college and attached hospital shall be reimbursed for five years as assistance beginning from commencement of academic session of admitted first year M.B.B.S. students after having obtained letter of permission (LoP) from the Medical Council of India / the Government of India. The amount of assistance will be reimbursed on a quarterly basis.
- 5.4 The additional amount of assistance will also be available under “the incentive scheme to procure high-end medical equipment” of the State Government by making application to the competent authority separately for this purpose. However, if the institution establishing medical college has received the assistance under “incentive scheme for establishment of super- speciality hospital”, it will not be entitled to receive assistance under “the incentive scheme to procure high-end medical equipment”. Once a institution starts getting assistance under this scheme, it will not be eligible to get assistance under “the incentive scheme to establish super speciality hospital”.
- 5.5 A public trust registered under the law may be given land, in any area in the state except that in the limits of Municipal Corporations, subject to the availability of the land, as per the provisions of resolution of the Government, Revenue Department dated 6/6/2003 pertaining to allotment of fallow land for non-agricultural purpose, in accordance with the minimum standard prescribed for land by the concerned council of the Government of India for higher medical educational institutions at a concessional rates of 50% of prevailing market price of the land. Land will be allocated at 100% rate of market price if land required is more than minimum standards prescribed.

6. Conditions :

- 6.1 Except for the assistance provided as above, no further assistance will be given for any recurring expenses. The concerned institute shall be liable for all recurring expenditure from the commencement of new self-financed medical college.
- 6.2 The expenditure incurred on land and building, equipment, furniture or repairs and maintenance will not be eligible counted for getting assistance.
- 6.3 The new self-financed medical college shall have to follow the rules and regulations of the State Government, the Medical Council of India and the Government of India.
- 6.4 The beneficiary institute shall have to appoint duly qualified and experienced medical, para medical, nursing, administrative, etc. teaching and non-teaching staff as per rules and regulations and other legal provisions of the Medical Council of India.

- 6.5 The beneficiary institute shall not utilize assistance provided for any other purpose.
- 6.6 The beneficiary institute shall be responsible for obtained necessary permissions or doing legal compliance for getting approval to establish new self-financed medical college and to run it as per rules and regulations of the Medical Council of India.
- 6.7 The fees and regulation of admission of new self-financed medical colleges to be established under this incentive scheme shall be as per the Gujarat Professional Medical Educational Colleges or Institutions Act, 2007.
- 6.8 The beneficiary institute shall have to give bank guarantee and indemnity bond as per prevailing policy of the State Government.
- 6.9 The eligible person getting assistance under this scheme, shall have to run new self-financed (Green Field) medical college for 10 years from its commencement.
- 6.10 If beneficiary person violates any condition of this resolution, it shall have to return the amount of assistance received, otherwise the amount of assistance paid, will be recovered as outstanding dues of land revenue.
- 6.11 Land may be allotted as per provision of resolution of Government, Revenue Department no. JMN/392003/454/A, dated 6/6/2003.
- 6.12 The new self-financed (Green Field) medical college and hospital getting the benefit under this scheme will have to join the "MA and MA-Vatsalya Scheme".
- 6.13 For the implementation of all terms and provisions laid down by this resolution, the beneficiary/eligible person will have to submit an undertaking as per Annexure on the stamp paper of Rs.100/-.

7. Method :

- 7.1 The beneficiary institute will have to submit an application to the Commissioner, Health, Medical Services and Medical Education, Gandhinagar to start a new self-financed (Green Field) medical college under this scheme.
- 7.2 Applicant will have to pay the fees of Rs. 1,00,000/- for scrutiny along with application in the form of Demand Draft of the Nationalized Bank drawn in favor of Additional Director, medical education and research, Gandhinagar.
- 7.3 The Commissioner, Health, Medical Services and Medical Education, Gandhinagar will scrutinize the application and documents and register the proposal of beneficiary/eligible person for new self-financed (Green Field) medical college.

- 7.4 The beneficiary / eligible person will submit an application to the Commissioner, Health, Medical Services and Medical Education, Gandhinagar in prescribed format with necessary documents to obtain the assistance after the commencement of new self-financed (Green Field) medical college as per approved registration.
- 7.5 The competent authority will constitute a Technical Group to examine the application received for assistance under the scheme.
- 7.6 The technical group will do physical scrutiny by visiting the new self-finance (Green Field) medical college and attached hospital premises and submit the report to the competent authority for the consideration for payment of assistance.
- 7.7 The competent authority i.e. the state level committee will sanction the amount of assistance to the beneficiary / eligible person after considering the report.

8. The State Level Committee:

The State Level Committee will be constituted to scrutinize the proposals and also sanction assistance to the beneficiary / eligible person. The committee will consist of the following members.

This committee will have the power to sanction assistance as per para. 5.2 for commencement of new self-financed (Green Field) medical college. It will also have the power to constitute technical group for physical verification.

The Government will separately decide the competent authority to sanction the assistance as per para. 5.3 for reimbursement of electricity duty paid in electricity bill of the medical college as well as attached hospital.

The Government shall have the power to interpret the provisions of this resolution.

Letter of undertaking

1. I solemnly affirm that the information provided in the application to get assistance under the scheme for establishment of new self-financed (Green Field) medical college for private and voluntary organisations, are true and correct as per my complete knowledge and belief.
2. I abide by all the terms and conditions as mentioned in the letter of approval No....., dated..... and the Government Resolution No. MCG-2015-SFS-7-J, dated 13/12/2016 to get assistance under the scheme for establishment of new self-financed (Green Field) medical college by private and voluntary organisations. The breach of any condition of these terms and conditions will be tantamount to breach of provisions of my sanctioned proposal under the scheme and I/We assure to return to the Government, the aggregate amount paid to us as assistance, on demand.
3. The following conditions will be binding to us.
 - (1) No amount of any recurrent expenditure will be given after the prescribed amount of assistance has been provided to the beneficiary institution. It will be the liability of the concerned institute to maintain the amount of recurrent expenditure from the commencement of new self-financed medical college.
 - (2) The expenditure incurred for land and building, equipment, furniture and expenditure incurred for repair and maintenance will not be counted to get assistance.
 - (3) The new self-financed (Green Field) medical college will have to abide by the rules and regulations of the State Government, the Medical Council of India and the Government of India.
 - (4) The beneficiary institute will have to appoint duly qualified and experienced medical, para medical, nursing, administrative etc. teaching and non-teaching staff as per rules and regulations and other legal provisions of the Medical Council of India.
 - (5) The beneficiary institute will not utilize available assistance for any other purpose.

- (6) The beneficiary institute will be liable for necessary legal compliance / responsibility of approval to establish new self-financed medical college and to start it as per rules and regulations of the Medical Council of India.
- (7) The standard of fees and regulation of admission of new self-financed medical colleges to be commenced under this incentive scheme will be as per Gujarat Professional Medical Educational Colleges or Institutions Act, 2007.
- (8) The beneficiary institute will have to give bank guarantee and indemnity bond as per prevailing policy of the State Government.
- (9) The eligible person who has received assistance under this scheme will not get assistance under the "incentive scheme of establishment of super speciality hospital"
- (10) The eligible person getting assistance under this scheme, will have to run new self-financed (Green Field) medical college for 10 years from its commencement.
- (11) If beneficiary person would violate any condition of this resolution, then they should return the assistance, else the assistance paid will be recovered as an outstanding dues of land revenue.

4. I hereby certify and declare that

- (1) I/we have not received any amount as an assistance or subsidy from the state government for setup claimed in this application.
- (2) I / We undertake to keep assistance restricted to preferential areas and places for the setup claimed in this application. This facility will be preserved for minimum ten years.
- (3) We will appoint duly qualified and experienced medical, para medical, nursing and administrative staff.

Proposal of the Commissioner, (Health, Medical services and Medical Education), Gandhinagar vide its SFS note dated 8/11/2016.

Preamble :

Medical education contributes significantly to make available services of M.B.B.S. doctors to demand of human resources in Government as well as private hospitals of the state. At present the number of registered medical graduates in the state is approximately one per 2000 population. The State Government intends to increase it and make available one doctor per 1000 population.

The State Government has significantly increased the number of medical graduates by establishing 11 medical colleges on self-finance basis since the year 2001. Still a large number of students seek admission in the institutions located in the other states and shortage of doctors is evident especially in remote and rural areas of the state. Moreover, the State Government has realized on the basis of experience of last 15 years that it is necessary to attract and encourage self-financed medical colleges for development of medical education in the state.

Medical education is an emerging area in education. The State Government seeks to provide facility of medical education to youth of the state in their own state instead of their seeking it in other states and to provide incentive to start medical colleges (Brown Field) on self-finance basis with a view to overcome the shortage of the doctors in the state.

It was under active consideration of the Government to frame a new policy to upgrade government hospitals in economically backward and tribal areas with advanced facilities and establish new self-financed (Brown Field) medical college.

Resolution :

After careful consideration, it is resolved to provide incentives for establishment of hospitals with advanced facilities along with new self-financed (Brown Field) medical colleges by upgrading the government hospitals.

- 1.1 **Name of the Scheme :** This scheme will be known as "Incentive scheme for establishment of New Self-Financed (Brown Field) Medical Colleges in the government hospitals of the state".
- 1.2 **Period of the Scheme :** This scheme will remain in force till 31-03-2022 from the date of issuance of this resolution. The assistance will be payable to new self-financed (Brown Field) medical colleges which have started functioning before 31-03-2022 i.e. before the expiry of the time limit of the scheme. The Government will have right to extend the period of the scheme.

2. Definitions :

- 2.1 **New Self-Financed (Brown Field) Medical College :** If a new self-financed (Brown Field) medical college is established by upgrading existing government hospital as per rules and regulations of the Medical Council of India will be known as new self-financed (Brown Field) medical college.

3. Eligible Areas :

The districts such as Tapi, Banaskantha, Amreli, Bharuch, Dahod and Panchmahal which do not have medical colleges will be eligible areas in the first phase for getting the assistance for a new self-financed (Brown Field) medical college in the state.

4. **Eligible Persons :** The institutions eligible to establish a medical college as per "The Establishment of Medical College Regulation, 1999" of Medical Council of India and amendments to it from time to time will be eligible person for the purpose of getting assistance under the scheme.

5. Amount of Assistance :

- 5.1. This assistance is only for the purpose of establishment of new self-financed (Brown Field) medical college at government hospitals for courses of MBBS as per rules and regulations of the Medical Council of India.
- 5.2 **Land :** As per norms of the Medical Council of India/the Government of India, a new self-financed (Brown Field) medical college requires 20 acres of land (maximum in two parts, minimum 5 acres in one part and remaining 15 acres in second part). Whatever land is available at government hospitals the required land (including hospital building) will be given on lease as per prevailing norms of the government. The Government will decide norms of the lease separately. If less than 20 acre of land is available at the government hospital, then the remaining land as per MCI norms will be made available within the prescribed distance on lease as per government norms.

- 5.3 Building :** Existing building at government hospital will be leased to eligible person as per prevalent norms of the government. In order to establish a new medical college, 300 beds are to be made available as per the rules and regulations of the M.C.I./the Government of India. In case of shortfall of beds required construction will be done or an eligible person will get assistance for the construction for providing shortfall of beds. If staff quarters are available at the government hospital, then land of staff quarters(including building of such quarters) will be made available on lease. Eligible person will be liable to repair the existing building of hospital as well as staff quarters. Eligible person will also have to provide the short fall of the remaining staff quarters(including hostel) and all academic facilities including the college building.
- 5.4 Equipment :**
- (1) Eligible person is entitled to get available equipment at the government hospital (with CMC) in existing conditions for this purpose. As per norms of Medical Council of India/ Government of India, remaining equipment for starting a new self-financed (Brown Field) medical college will be made available by the eligible person.
 - (2) The additional amount of assistance will be available as per the eligible area under “incentive scheme for assistance to procure equipment to provide medical services” of the state government and for that purpose a separate application will be required to be submitted to the competent authority.
- 5.5 Human Resources :** The eligible person will have to provide required medical, para medical, administrative and teaching and non-teaching staff for establishment of new self-financed (Brown Field) medical college as per rules and regulations of the Medical Council of India / the Government of India. The existing human resources of government hospital may be made available on loan services for the duration as per terms and conditions of the contract.
- 5.6** The assistance of Rs. 7.5 lakh per seat will be available after completion of admission process of the first year M.B.B.S. keeping in view the number of sanctioned seats to the eligible person who has got the letter of permission (LOP) to start new self-financed (Brown Field) medical college from the M.C.I. / the Government of India. After receiving the renewal permission for next year from the M.C.I./ the Government of India, the assistance of Rs. 7.5 lakh per sanctioned seat will be available for the respective year. This assistance will be available only for five years after the start of new self-financed (Brown Field) medical college. No assistance of any kind will be available after five years under this scheme.
- 5.7** The electricity duty paid in the electricity bill of the medical college and attached hospital shall be reimbursed for five years as assistance beginning from commencement of academic session of admitted first year M.B.B.S. students after having obtained letter of permission (LoP) from the Medical Council of India / the Government of India. The amount of assistance will be reimbursed on a quarterly basis.

6. Conditions :

- 6.1. Except for the assistance provided as above, no further assistance shall be given to beneficiary institution except mentioned in this resolution. But after freezing the amount equivalent to the grant allocated to government hospital for recurring expenditure by the government shall be made available as the assistance. The concerned institute to maintain the amount of recurrent expenditure from the beginning of commencement of new self-financed (Brown Field) medical college.

Proposal of the Commissioner, (Health, Medical Services and Medical Education), Gandhinagar vide its SFS note dated 25/1/2016.

Preamble :

The availability of specialised and high end medical facilities in CHC and District hospitals of inaccessible and remote areas is limited. It has become necessary to provide incentive to private and non-governmental organisations to provide such medical services in order to address challenges arising out of increasing burden of NCD, demand of more services from interior areas, rush of patients in public health institutions, lack of qualified and trained human resources etc.

Besides providing incentives for providing health services, the State Government intends to create more employment opportunities. In order to achieve this objective, it was under the active consideration of the Government to formulate a new policy to provide incentives for setting up new super speciality hospital in the state.

Resolution :

After careful consideration, it is resolved to provide assistance to start new super speciality hospital by the private sector and non-government institutes subject to following conditions:

- 1.1 **Name of the Scheme :** This scheme will be known as "Incentive Scheme for establishment of new super speciality hospital" to provide health services by private and non-government institutes.
- 1.2 **Duration of Scheme :** This scheme will remain in force till 31/3/2022 from the date of issuance of this resolution. The assistance will be payable to new super speciality hospital which have started functioning before 31/3/2022 i.e. before the expiry of the time limit of this scheme. Super Speciality Hospital established before the commencement of this resolution will not be entitled to get assistance under the scheme.

2. Definitions :

2.1 Super-specialty hospital : A tertiary health-care, hospital engaged in diagnosis and treatment of patients related any one or more than one of super speciality subjects having minimum 10 beds of super-speciality treatment, but not less than total of 50 beds will be known as super speciality hospital.

2.2 Super-specialty subjects : "Nephrology, Urology, Medical Oncology, Surgical Oncology, Radiation Oncology, Cardiology, Cardiothoracic Surgery, Neurology, Neuro-Surgery, Plastic Surgery, Medical Gastroenterology, Surgical Gastroenterology, Spine Surgery and Neonatology" will be considered as super speciality subjects. The state government may add subjects in the list at its discretion.

2.3 Authorized bank loans : The loan approved by a bank for construction of building and equipments for super speciality hospital will be considered as authorised bank loan. In case of building taken by way of resale, the loan received towards construction of building will only be treated as authorised. In case of readymade building or multi-storey building, out of aggregate expenditure only the amount of loan obtained towards the cost of the construction will be included in the authorised loan. The price of building will be determined as per instructions of the government in this regard from time to time.

3. Eligible area : Whole of the state will be considered as eligible area for Super Speciality Hospital.

4. Eligible person : Any expert doctor registered with the Gujarat Medical Council, registered partnership firm or institution registered under act will be eligible person for the purpose of getting this assistance. Companies, Charitable Trusts, Societies and Co-operative Institutions, Government and Semi-Government Board, Corporation, Panchayat, Municipality, Municipal Corporation etc. will also be eligible person.

5. Amount of Assistance :

5.1 This assistance is only for the purpose of establishment of a new Super Speciality Hospital.

5.2 Assistance of Ten Percent of the amount of loan paid by bank for the purpose of purchase of medical equipments for establishment of Super Speciality Hospital will be paid as capital subsidy. The maximum limit for such assistance will be Rs. 10 crore.

5.3 Interest subvention up to 4% on amount of interest payable on authorised bank loan received (maximum limit of Rs. 40 Crore) for the purpose of establishment of new Super Speciality Hospital will be payable as assistance. This assistance will be available for maximum 7 years from the date of commencement of the hospital.

5.4 The electricity duty paid in the electricity bill of the hospital will be reimbursed on quarterly basis as assistance for five years from date of the commencement of hospital.

6. Conditions :

6.1 The capital subsidy of 10% will be payable on loan amount disbursed by the bank for purchase of medical equipment after equipment has been installed and has started working. This assistance will be paid only after the date of operationalisation of the hospital.

6.2 The amount of assistance towards interest subvention will be given for seven years. The amount of assistance of the first stage will be made available one year after the operationalisation of the Super Speciality Hospital. Afterwards, every year the amount of interest up to 4% on outstanding bank loan will be paid in six phases thus totalling to total seven years. The procedure of paying assistance will be notified separately.

6.3 The reimbursement of electricity duty paid in the electricity bill of the hospital will be paid quarterly from the date of commencement of Super Speciality Hospital. The procedure to be followed in this regard will be notified separately.

6.4 The assistance under the scheme will be available only if services of super speciality subjects are continued in new Super Speciality Hospital.

6.5 The recurring expenditure incurred for facility under this scheme will not be entitled for the assistance. The hospital will be liable to pay all recurring expenses incurred since start of the hospital.

6.6 The expenditure incurred on land and building, furniture, air conditioner, Cooler repair or maintenance will not be eligible for loan assistance.

6.7 The Super Speciality Hospital established under this scheme will be kept in working condition for minimum seven years. The medical equipment purchased through bank loan cannot be shifted from the hospital to any other place.

6.8 The eligible person will have to appoint duly qualified and experienced medical, para medical, nursing, administrative, etc., staff to run the super speciality hospital.

- 6.9 The beneficiary will be liable to comply with the concerned provisions of acts/rules for operationalisation of facility under this scheme.
- 6.10 If beneficiary / eligible person violates any condition of this resolution, then they shall return the amount of assistance else the amount of assistance paid, will be recovered as an outstanding dues of land revenue.
- 6.11 The eligible person getting assistance under this scheme will not be entitled to get assistance under "Incentive scheme to procure equipment to provide medical services". The hospital run by the charitable trust which has got assistance for equipment under this scheme, will not be eligible for assistance for same equipment under the resolution of the Government no. HSP-10122013-N.B.47-A (Part File), dated 2/7/2015.
- 6.12 If the eligible person getting assistance under this scheme desires to get assistance under the "Incentive scheme for establishment of new self-financed (Green Field) medical college in the State" before completion of five years from start of the hospital, the assistance available under this scheme will cease when approval of new assistance is granted.
- 6.13 The hospital getting the benefit under this scheme will have to join the "MA / MA Vatsalya Scheme"
- 6.14 The beneficiary/eligible person will have to furnish the deed of undertaking as per Annexure on the stamp paper of Rs.100/- for the implementation of all terms and provisions laid down by this resolution,
- 6.15 The assistance under this scheme will not be available, if similar type of assistance has been availed under any scheme of the state government.
- 6.16 Only one-time assistance will be available under this scheme.

- 7.2 Applicant will have to pay the fees for scrutiny along with application in the form of Demand Draft of the Nationalized Bank drawn in favour of Government. The amount of fees for scrutiny of the application will be Rs. 20,000/-
- 7.3 The Commissioner, Health, Medical Services and Medical Education, Gandhinagar will scrutinize the application and documents and register the proposal of beneficiary/eligible person for new Super Speciality Hospital.



Proposal of the Commissioner (Health, Medical services and Medical education) vide its SFS Note dated 25/1/2016.

Preamble :

The availability of specialized and high end medical facilities in CHC and District hospitals of inaccessible and remote areas is limited. It has become necessary to provide incentive to private and non-governmental organizations to provide such medical services in order to address challenges arising out of increasing burden of NCD, demand of more services from interior areas, rush of patients in public health institutions, lack of qualified and trained human resources etc.

Besides providing incentives for providing health services, the State Government intend to create more employment opportunities. In order to achieve this objective, it was under the active consideration of the Government to formulate a new policy for assistance to Procure Equipment to Provide Medical Services by private and non-governmental organizations in the state.

Resolution :

After careful consideration, it is resolved to publish the policy of providing cash assistance for procurement of equipment to provide high end medical services related to diagnosis of the Cardiology and Radiology, basic specialty hospital and super specialty hospital run by the private and non-governmental institutions subject to the following conditions.

- 1.1 The Name of the Scheme :** This scheme will be known as "Incentive Scheme for procuring high end medical equipment" to provide medical services by the private and non-governmental institutions.
- 1.2 Period of Scheme :** This scheme will remain in force till 31/3/2022 from the date of issuance of this resolution. The equipment purchased, installed and put into operation before expiry of the scheme i.e. before 31-03-2022 will be considered eligible equipment for assistance.

2. Definitions :

- 2.1 Diagnostic Services Centre :** A new diagnostic centre or an existing diagnostic centre willing to set up new equipments required to diagnose or treat illness will be called a Diagnostic Service Centre.
- 2.2 Basic Speciality Hospital :** Any existing basic speciality hospital or a new hospital having facilities of one or more speciality subjects with minimum of 10 beds for patients, for the diagnosis and treatment mentioned in Column no.-1 of the Annexure-B, will be known as Basic Speciality Hospital.
- 2.3 Super Speciality Hospital :** Any existing super speciality hospital or a new hospital having facilities of one or more super-speciality subjects with minimum of 10 beds for patients, for the diagnosis and treatment mentioned in Column no.-1 of the Annexure-C, will be known as Super Speciality Hospital.
- 2.4 New equipment :** An original equipment or a complete unit purchased from manufacturer or his authorized agent will be treated as new equipment. Equipment shifted from other location or second hand equipment imported from foreign countries or second hand equipments will not be considered as new equipment.
- 2.5 Aggregate Purchase Cost :** The basic amount paid for the purchase of equipment along with its accessories and amount paid as all government taxes will be considered as Aggregate Purchase Cost. In case of import of the equipment, import duty or cess paid at the place of import will be included in the cost.
- 2.6 Backward Talukas:-** 49 backward taluka areas declared by the State will be as per the Annexure - E.

3. Eligible Areas :

- (1) Whole of the state except areas included in the Ahmedabad, Vadodara, Surat and Rajkot Municipal Corporation will be considered as eligible areas for the assistance for Diagnostic Services Centers. However, for the services oriented hospitals run by the Public Charitable Trusts, will be eligible for the purpose of this scheme in whole of the state.
- (2) Whole of the state except cities having population of more than 2 lacs will be considered as eligible area to get assistance for basic speciality hospital. Census of 2011 will be the base for calculation of population. However, for basic speciality hospital run by the service oriented Charitable Trusts, will be eligible for the purpose of this scheme in whole of state.
- (3) Whole of the state will be considered as eligible area to get assistance for super speciality hospital.

4. **Eligible Person:-** Any Doctor registered with the Gujarat Medical Council, registered partnership firm or institution registered under law will be eligible person for the purpose of getting assistance. Companies, Charitable Trusts, Societies and Co-operative Institutions, Government and Semi-Government Board, Corporation, Society, Panchayat, Municipality, Municipal Corporation will also be eligible persons.

5. **Eligible Equipment:-**

(1) For Diagnostic Services Center, Equipment mentioned in the Column no.2 of the Annexure-A enclosed herewith will be eligible for getting assistance under this scheme.

(2) For Basic Speciality Hospital, Equipment mentioned in the Column no.2 of the Annexure-B enclosed herewith will be eligible for getting assistance under this scheme.

(3) For Super Speciality Hospital, Equipment mentioned in the Column no.2 of the Annexure-C enclosed herewith will be eligible for getting assistance under this scheme.

Explanation : Attachment to the machine will also be treated as a machine and its cost will be included in the cost of machine.

6. **Amount of Assistance :**

6.1 This assistance is for the purchase of new equipment only. Second-hand or used equipment installed by transferring from the other place in the country or equipment installed after import will not be treated as a new equipment and such equipment will not be eligible for getting assistance under this scheme.

6.2 This assistance will be available only for the equipment as shown in the column no.2 of the Annexure – A, B and C.

6.3 30% of the aggregate purchase cost of equipment (inclusive of all tax) will be available as assistance, subject to the maximum amount of assistance shown in the column no.3 of the Annexure – A, B and C for the Backward Taluka Areas of the State. (As per Annexure-E)

Explanation : 30% of the aggregate purchase cost or assistance shown in the column no.3, whichever is less will be available as assistance for the equipment.

6.4 20% of the aggregate purchase cost of equipment (inclusive of all tax) will be available as assistance subject to the maximum amount of assistance shown in the Column no. 4 of the Annexure – A, B and C in all areas of the state excluding Backward Taluka Areas.

Explanation : 20% of the aggregate purchase cost or assistance shown in the column no.4, whichever is less will be available as an assistance for the equipment.

6.5 Assistance under this scheme will be available only for the equipment purchased, installed and made operational after the date of issuance of this policy.

6.6 Any person can get maximum assistance up to Rs. 10 crore under this scheme, but can submit application under the scheme within stipulated time limit more than one time to get assistance for different equipment.

7. Terms :

7.1 Amount of assistance will be paid in two phases. First installment (50% amount) will be available after starting operation of the equipment and second installment (remaining 50% amount) will be paid after the completion of one year from the date of commencement of date of operation.

7.2 Recurrent expenditure incurred for the facility under this scheme will not be counted in the cost of equipment and will not be eligible for assistance.

7.3 Investment in land and building, furniture, air conditioner, cooler or other such equipment will not be counted as cost eligible for assistance.

7.4 The hospital run by the charitable trust which has got the assistance for the equipment under this scheme is not eligible for the assistance for the same equipment under the resolution of the government no. HSP-122013-N.B.47-A (Part File), dated 2/7/2015.

7.5 The equipment installed under this scheme will be maintained in working condition for minimum 5 years at the same place from the commencement of its operation. Such equipment may be transferred from one place to another place within the same town / village with prior approval.

7.6 The eligible person will have to appoint duly qualified and experienced medical / para-medical / nursing staff to operate and maintain the equipment.

7.7 The beneficiary will be liable to follow relevant laws and rules to operationalize the facility under the scheme.

7.8 If beneficiary/eligible person violates any term or condition of the resolution, he will return the amount of assistance under the scheme, else the paid amount of assistance will be recovered as outstanding dues of land revenue.

7.9 The person eligible to get assistance under this scheme will not be eligible to get assistance under "Incentive scheme for establishment of super speciality hospital"

- 7.10 The hospital getting the benefit under this scheme will have to join the "MA / MA Vatsalyam scheme"
- 7.11 One time assistance will be available for the same kind of equipment under this scheme.
- 7.12 As prescribed by this resolution, the beneficiary / eligible person will have to submit an under-taking as per Annexure – D on the stamp paper of Rs. 100/- to comply with all provisions, terms and conditions as laid down under this resolution.

8. Procedure :

- 8.1 Beneficiary/eligible person will have to apply for registration with necessary documents in the prescribed format to the C.D.M.O of the respective district.
- 8.2 Applicant will have to pay the fees for scrutiny along with application in the form of Demand Draft of the Nationalized Bank drawn in favor of the Government. Amount of scrutiny fee will be 1% of the cost of the proposed equipment mentioned in the application or minimum Rs. 5000/-, an amount whichever is higher but maximum limit to the extent of Rs. 20,000/-.
- 8.3 The Chief District Medical Officer will scrutinize the application and documents and register the proposal of beneficiary of the eligible person for equipment up to the price of Rs. 50/- lakhs.
- 8.4 The proposal of beneficiary / eligible person for equipment costing more than Rs. 50/- lakhs will be forwarded to the office of the Commissionerate of Health, Medical Services and Medical Education, Gandhinagar.
- 8.5 The office of Commissioner of Health, Medical Services and Medical Education, Gandhinagar will scrutinize the received application and the documents and register the proposals of beneficiary / eligible person for equipment costing more than Rs. 50/- lakhs.
- 8.6 The beneficiary / eligible person will submit an application to the Chief District Medical Officer in prescribed format with necessary documents to obtain the amount of assistance after functioning of installed equipment as per approved registration.
- 8.7 The competent authority will constitute a District Level Committee or State Level Committee of Technical Groups to verify the received application for getting claimed amount of assistance.
- 8.8 The technical group will undertake the detailed physical scrutiny by visiting the center / the place of hospital premises and submit the report to the committee of the competent authority for the consideration to pay the amount of assistance.

8.9 The competent authority i.e. the district level committee or state level committee after considering the report will sanction the amount of assistance to the beneficiary / eligible person.

9. The District Level Committee

The District Level Committee will be constituted to scrutinize the proposal and sanction the assistance to the beneficiary / eligible person. The power to sanction the assistance up to Rs.15/- lakhs in areas of backward taluka and up to Rs.10/- lakhs in the areas other than the backward talukas will be vested with this committee. The committee will consist of the following members.

This committee will have the power to sanction assistance for equipment having aggregate cost up to Rs.50/- lakh. It will also have the power to constitute technical group for physical verification as per instructions issued by the Government from time to time.

10. The State Level Committee :

The State Level Committee will be constituted to scrutinize the received document and to sanction the assistance for equipment costing more than Rs. 50/- lakh to the beneficiary / eligible person. The power to sanction the assistance up to Rs.15/- lakhs in areas of backward taluka and up to Rs.10/- lakhs in the areas other than the backward talukas will be vested with this committee. The committee will consist of the following members.
